Amounts reported for governmental activities in the statement of activities (page 25) are different because:

Governmental funds report capital outlays as expenditures. However, in the statement of activities the cost of those assets is allocated over their estimated useful lives and reported as depreciation expense. This is the amount by which capital outlays exceeded depreciation in the current period.	48,640
The net effect of various transactions involving capital assets (i.e., donations, disposals, and sales) is to increase net assets.	4,013
Revenues that provide current financial resources are reported in the funds. Revenues relating to prior periods that became available in the current period are not current-period revenues in the statement of activities.	(1,221)
Revenues in the statement of activities that do not provide current financial resources are not reported as revenues in the funds.	4,379
The issuance of long-term debt (e.g., bonds, leases) provides current financial resources to governmental funds, while the repayment of principal of long-term debt consumes the current financial resources of governmental funds. Neither transaction, however, has any effect on net assets. Also, governmental funds report the effect of issuance costs, premiums, discounts, and similar items when debt is first issued, whereas these amounts are deferred and amortized in the statement of activities. This amount is the net effect of these difference's in the treatment of long-term debt and related items.	18,748
Some expenses reported in the statement of activities do not require the use of current financial resources and, therefore, are not reported as expenditures in governmental funds.	(10,794)
The net revenue of certain activities of internal service funds is reported with governmental activities.	<u>62</u>
