Dear Courier City/Oscawana Resident and Residential Business Owner:

On Thursday December 4, 2008, Tampa City Council voted to amend the city ordinance on residential parking to include the boundaries defined by Kennedy Boulevard by the north; Swann Avenue by the south; Armenia Avenue by the west and Fremont Avenue by the east. Prior to the December 2008 holidays, staff members of the Department of Public Works met to discuss an appropriate implementation plan. Staff members agreed that implementing the plan through a series of smaller phases would best serve the neighborhood.

As of this time, work orders for sign fabrication and installation have been executed and residential parking permits have been designed and ordered for **Phase IV**. Please see the attached map for details of phase IV implementation. With an expeditious approach in mind, the Department of Public Works has agreed to the following project implementation schedule:

Week of March 8th through March 12th – the Fort Brooke Administrative offices (located at 107 North Franklin Street) will be open from 8:00 AM to 6:00 PM for residential parking permit verification and distribution. The Parking Division will validate your parking at the Fort Brooke Parking garage. You will be required to bring a minimum of two (2) of the following items to prove residency:

1. Current utility bill in your name with address in the defined boundary
2. Current property rental agreement or current real estate purchase document
3. Current land line telephone bill in your name with address in the defined boundary
4. Current Hillsborough County property tax bill in your name with the address listed in the defined boundary
5. Valid Florida driver's license with address in the defined boundary

Week of March 15th through March 19th – Sign installation will take place.

Week of March 29th through April 3rd - Warnings will be issued and City of Tampa Parking Enforcement Officer will be visibly present within the boundaries during the hours of enforcement.

Week of April 5th through April 10th – Parking permit enforcement begins.

Within these boundaries, the residential parking program will be enforced seven days per week during the hours of 6:00PM to 6:00 AM. Each residential address will receive a minimum of one (1) residential parking permit and one (1) residential guest-parking permit at no charge. In the event that a residential address is not assigned any off-street parking, a second residential parking permit will be issued at no additional charge. Additional residential guest parking permits may be purchased in advance for a fee of \$3 per permit per day. Residential business addresses within the prescribed boundaries will be eligible for a minimum of four (4) residential business parking permits valid from 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM, seven days per week, at no charge.
