

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE PROPOSAL OF THE SECOND LOW BIDDER, COASTAL ELECTRIC CONSTRUCTORS, INC., PERTAINING TO CONTRACT 6-C-78, HANNA AND TROUT PUMPING STATIONS STANDBY POWER FACILITIES, IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$240,000.00; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF TAMPA; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on October 10, 2006, the Mayor of the City of Tampa received two bids, tabulation of such bids being hereto attached for informational purposes for the construction of the Hanna and Trout Pumping Stations Standby Power Facilities, Contract No. 6-C-78; and

WHEREAS, the City of Tampa Minority Business Development Office determined that the proposal submitted by the apparent low bidder, The New Florida Industrial Electric, Inc. did not comply with Executive Order 98-02, Chapter 26.5-103; and

WHEREAS, the proposal submitted by The New Florida Industrial Electric, Inc. was found to be non responsive; therefore award to said low bidder is not approved; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with criteria set forth in the Contract Documents, award can be made to Coastal Electric Constructors, Inc., the next lowest responsive, responsible bidder for construction of said project; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Tampa is recommending that the proposal of Coastal Electric Constructors, Inc. be accepted, funds therefore being available in the appropriate account.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF TAMPA, FLORIDA THAT:

Section 1. The proposal of Coastal Electric Constructors, Inc., in the amount of \$240,000.00, for construction of the Hanna and Trout Pumping Stations Standby Power Facilities, Contract 6-C-78, in accordance with plans, specifications and other related contract documents prepared by the City of Tampa Contract Administration Department, is hereby approved and accepted, and the Contract is hereby awarded to said Contractor.

Section 2. This Resolution, which is not part of the contract documents, authorizes the Mayor to execute and the City Clerk to attest and affix the official seal of the City of Tampa to the Contract for and on behalf of the City of Tampa.

Section 3. The contract documents for the construction of said Project, which documents are now on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Tampa, are hereby approved in their entirety or in substantially similar form.

Section 4. The Director of the Contract Administration Department is hereby authorized to issue, in written form only, work directive changes authorizing additions, deletions or revisions resulting from unforeseen conditions or emergencies, said directives to be incorporated in subsequently issued change orders approved by the City Council.

Section 5. Any and all technical errors, informalities and irregularities in the proposal of the Contractor are hereby waived.

Section 6. The bid security of all bidders shall be returned in accordance with the provisions of the contract documents for this Project.

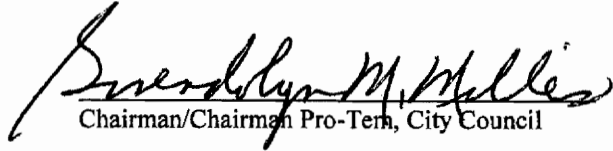
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Section 7. The project construction costs in the amount of \$240,000.00 are provided in the Budget of the City of Tampa for the Fiscal Year ending September 30, 2007, in Account No. SS0342BHZ-06300.

Section 8. Other proper officials of the City of Tampa are authorized to do all things necessary and proper in order to carry out and make effective the provisions of this Resolution, which shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
