Tampa's mayor serves as the chief executive officer for the City of Tampa. In his official capacity as mayor, Buckhorn represents the City at ceremonial and community events. In addition to daily duties associated with the operation of city government, Buckhorn makes recommendations to Tampa City Council for the creation of ordinances and resolutions. Each year the administration presents a recommended budget to City Council for input and citizen involvement.

Tampa City Council is the legislative branch of city government and operates in accordance with the provisions of the 1974 Revised Charter of the City of Tampa. City Council enacts ordinances and resolutions that the mayor administers as chief executive officer. Seven council members are elected by the voters within the city limits to serve a four-year term. Council members for Districts 1, 2, and 3 are elected at-large (citywide) and those from Districts 4, 5, 6, and 7 are elected in individual districts. City Council meetings are generally held the first and third Thursday of each month at 9 a.m. in Council Chambers, located on the third floor of historic City Hall, 315 East Kennedy Boulevard, to enact legislation pertaining to city business. All meetings are open to the public. Tampa City Council also serves as the Community Redevelopment Agency.

A division of Neighborhood Services, Code Enforcement and Business Tax, responds to concerns from citizens that affect the quality of life within the city such as zoning, overgrown lots or yards, inoperative vehicles, maintenance of structures, illegal signs, and public nuisances. The department is also responsible for the issuance of all business tax receipts and business operating permits and the collection of rental certificate fees. In addition, Code Enforcement and Business Tax regulates rental properties in Tampa by certifying landlords are in compliance with the Florida State Minimum Housing Standards. The department also has a dedicated inspector responsible for inspecting business and property owners for compliance with applicable alcohol beverage/wet zoning.

A division of Code Enforcement and Business Tax, Community Affairs investigates discrimination complaints in housing, employment, public accommodations, and any other alleged unfair practices. Outreach activities, such as EEOC and HUD Fair Housing seminars are also conducted and supported. The division also addresses concerns or inquiries about the general rights of the disabled, and serves as a liaison to the Mayor's Alliance for Persons with Disabilities. Additionally, the division provides technical assistance and support to the City of Tampa Human Rights Board, Tampa-Hillsborough County Human Rights Council, Mayor's Hispanic Advisory Council, and Community Development Block Grant Advisory Committee, and various outreach activities.

Community Redevelopment Areas (CRA) are commonly used as a redevelopment tool for blighted areas in need of revitalization. Currently, there are over 140 CRAs in the State of Florida and the City of Tampa has nine. The activities and programs offered within a CRA are administered by the Community Redevelopment Agency. Tampa's Community Redevelopment Agency is responsible for developing and implementing a plan that addresses the unique needs of each targeted CRA. The plan includes the overall goals for redevelopment in the area, as well as identifying the types of programs and projects planned for the area.
