Re: Certification of Projects Receiving American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Funds

ISSUE: Section 1511 of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 requires the following certification:

“With respect to covered funds made available to State or local governments for infrastructure investments, the Governor, mayor, or other chief executive, as appropriate, shall certify that the infrastructure investment has received the full review and vetting required by law and that the chief executive accepts responsibility that the infrastructure investment is an appropriate use of taxpayer dollars. Such certification shall include a description of the investment, the estimated total cost, and the amount of covered funds to be used, and shall be posted on a website and linked to the website established by section 1526. A State or local agency may not receive infrastructure investment funding from funds made available in this Act unless this certification is made and posted.”

SUMMARY: The Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) projects on the attached certifications have met all program and ARRA requirements. For the projects on the fundable list, agreements will be prepared as complete assistance applications are received, and the financial integrity of the system is verified. Certification of the additional projects for the CWSRF program is requested in case one or more projects on the funded list cannot proceed or if any funds that are unused by other states become available. The attached certifications must be signed and posted on the recovery.gov web site prior to the execution of any assistance agreements for ARRA funds

ASK: We request that the Secretary sign the attached certifications.
