# Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964

For such a purpose, they may need to hire a court reporter to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.

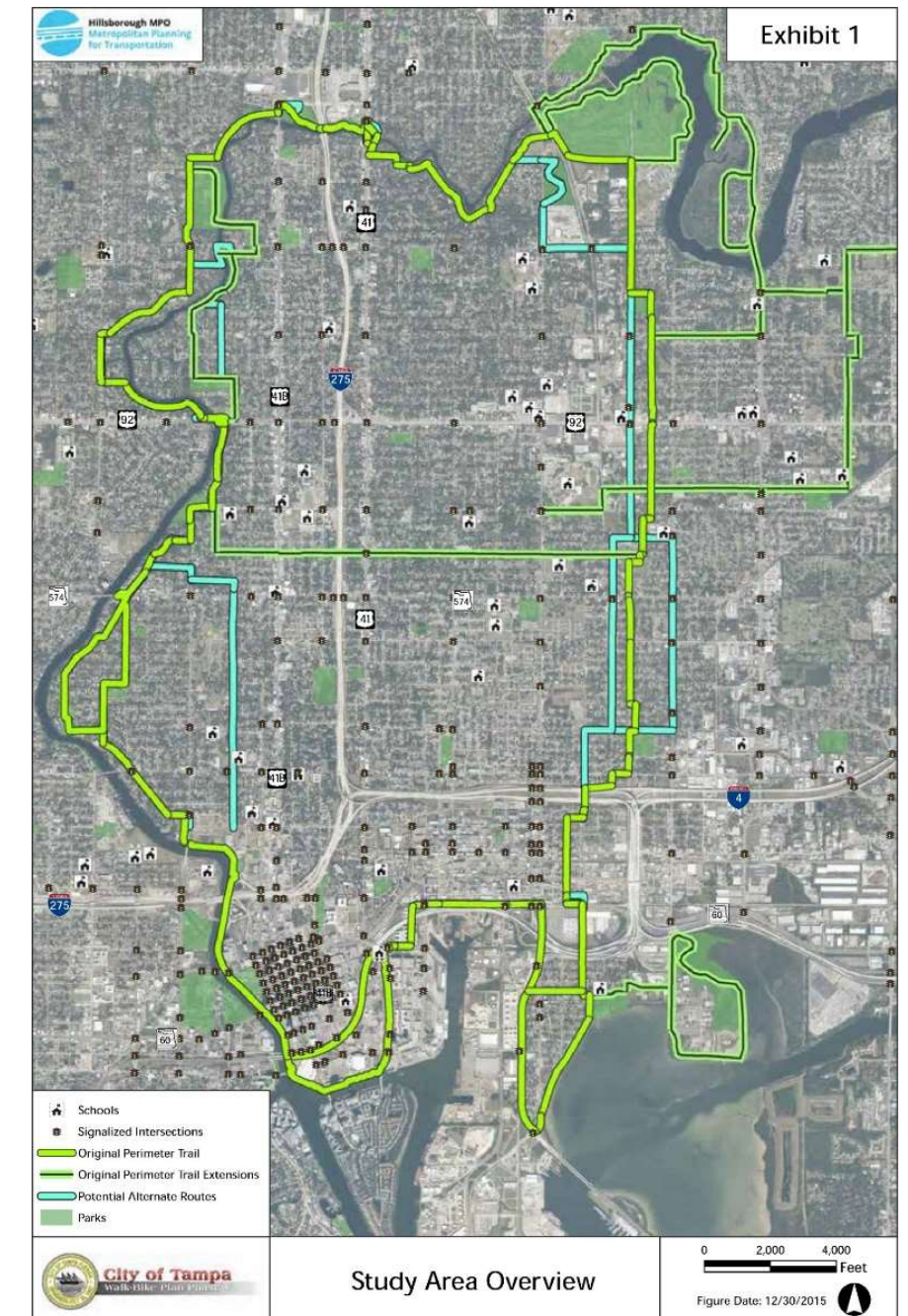

# What is Green Artery?



- A 22-mile interconnected pedestrian/bicycle network around central Tampa
- Links Downtown Tampa to Palmetto Beach, Ybor City, Rowlett Park, Sulphur Springs, Lowry Park, and along the Hillsborough River back to Downtown Tampa
- Connects neighborhoods, parks, and schools along connection

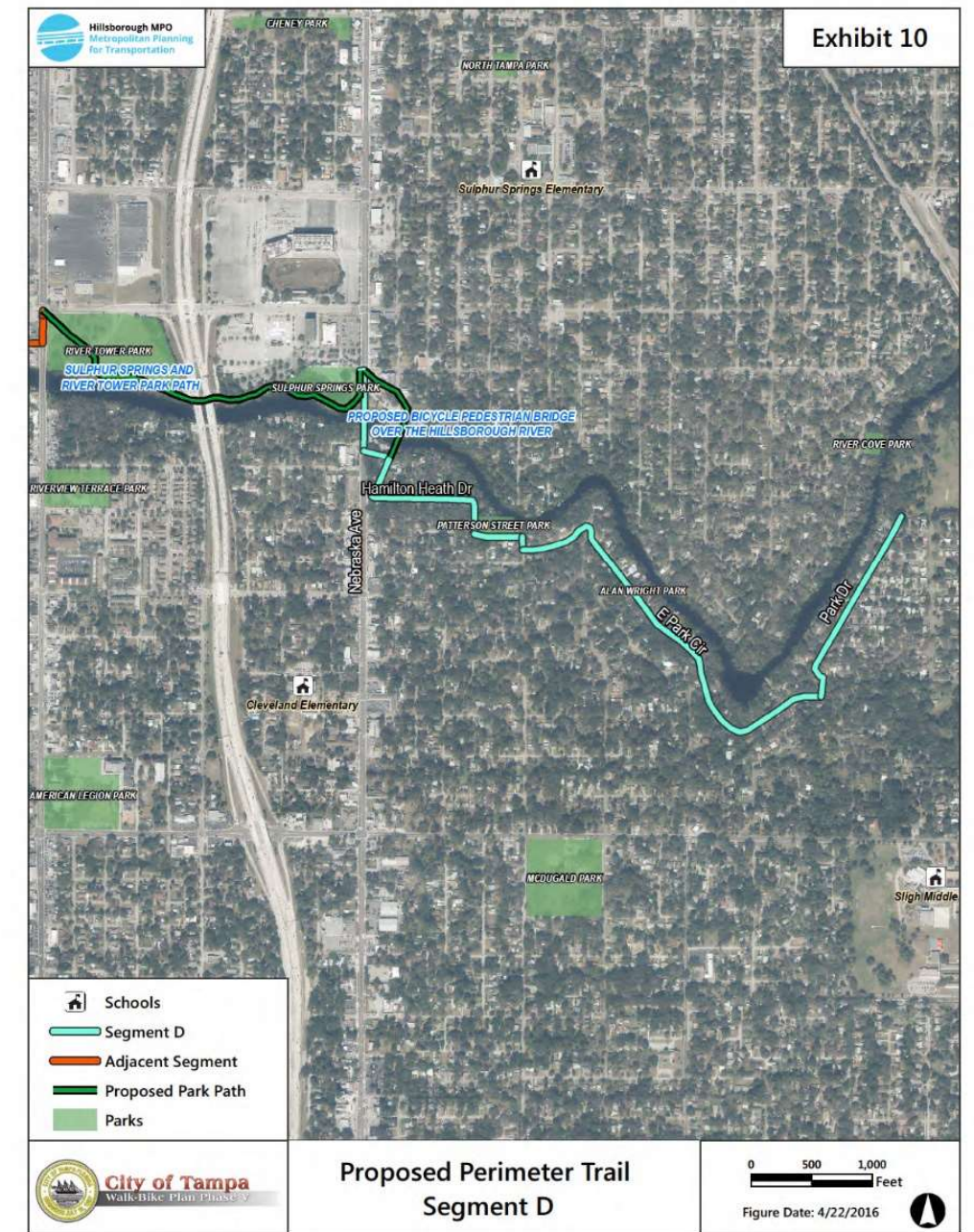

# What is Segment D?

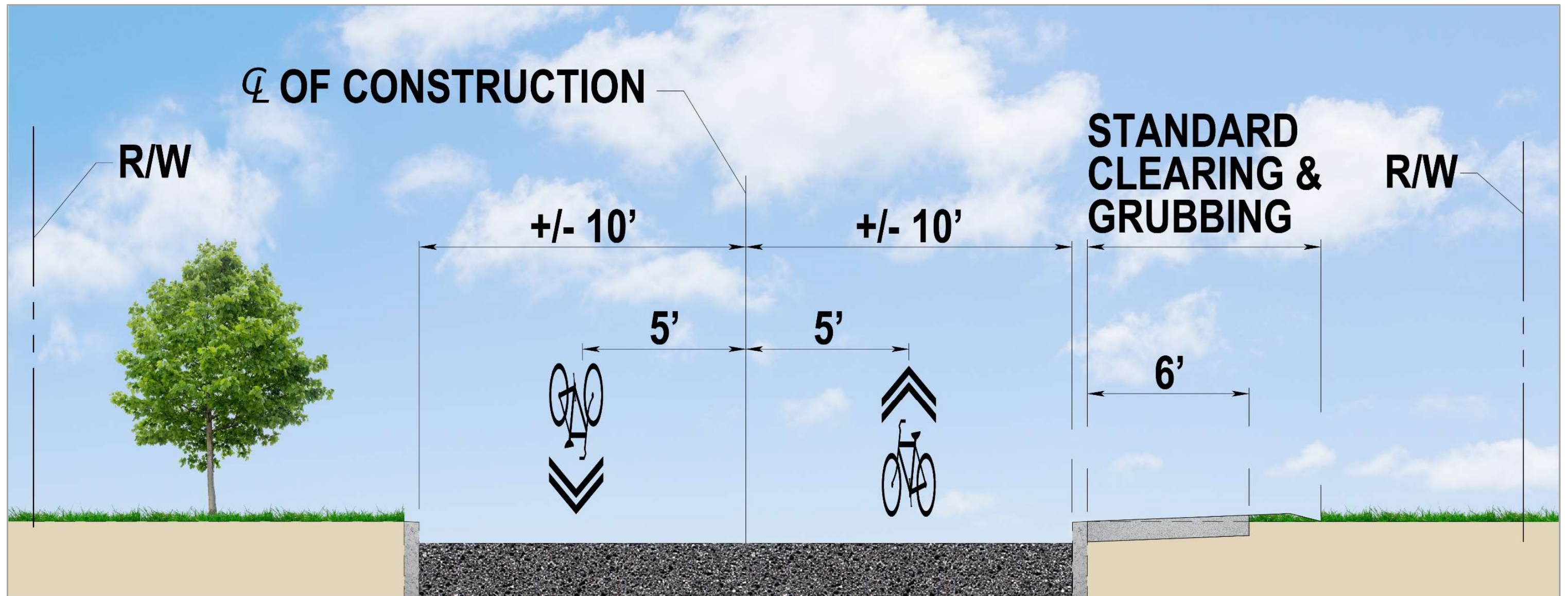
- Provides traffic calming and bicycle and pedestrian improvements
- Bicycle Boulevard markings on:
  - Park Dr.
  - Park Cir.
  - 12<sup>th</sup> St.
  - Patterson St.
  - Hamilton Heath Dr.
  - Van Dyke Pl
  - Hollywood St.
- 6-ft sidewalk east side of Van Dyke Pl from Hamilton Heath Dr. to Hollywood St.



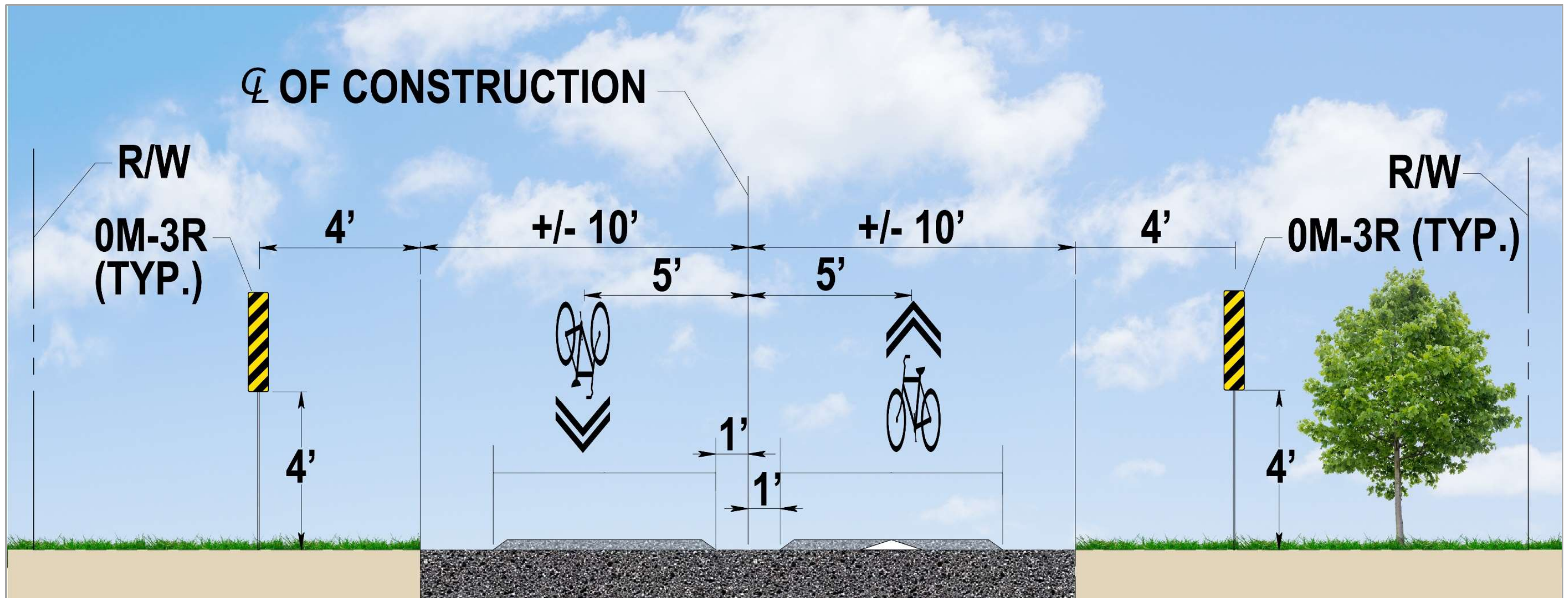

# Typical Section 1 – w/ sidewalk

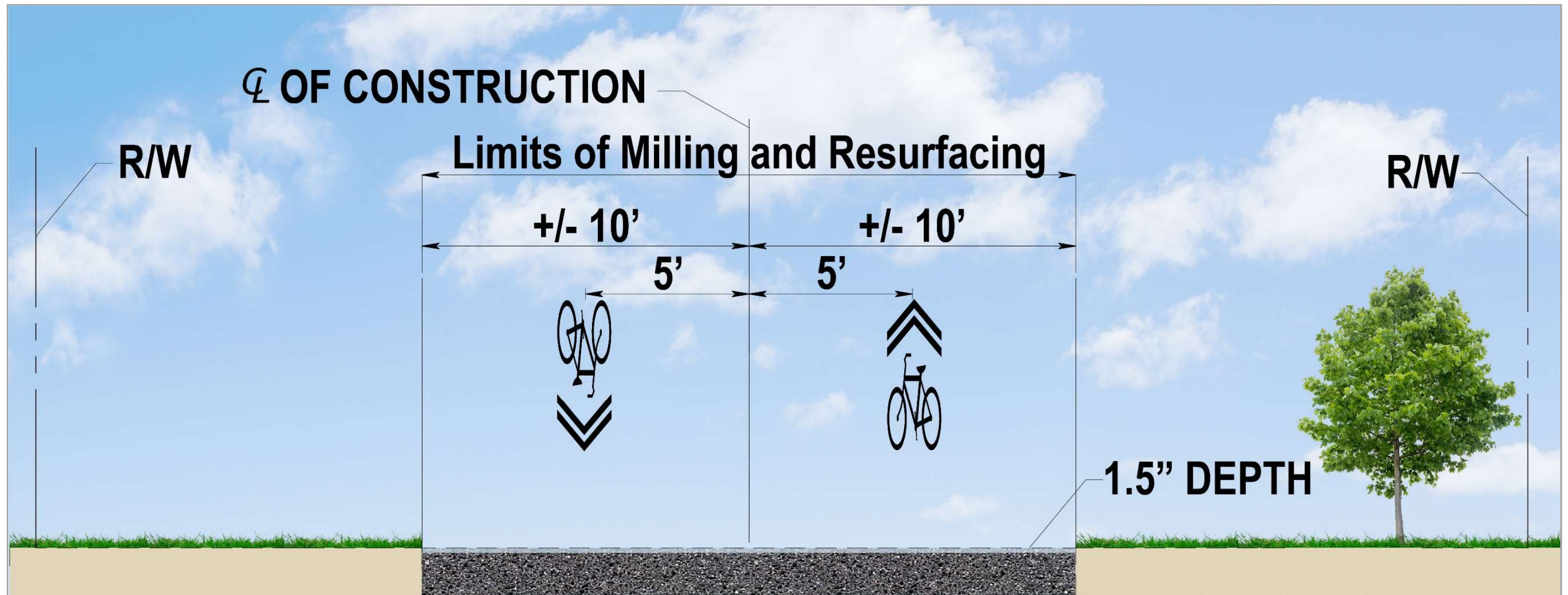


# Typical Section 2 – w/ speed cushions



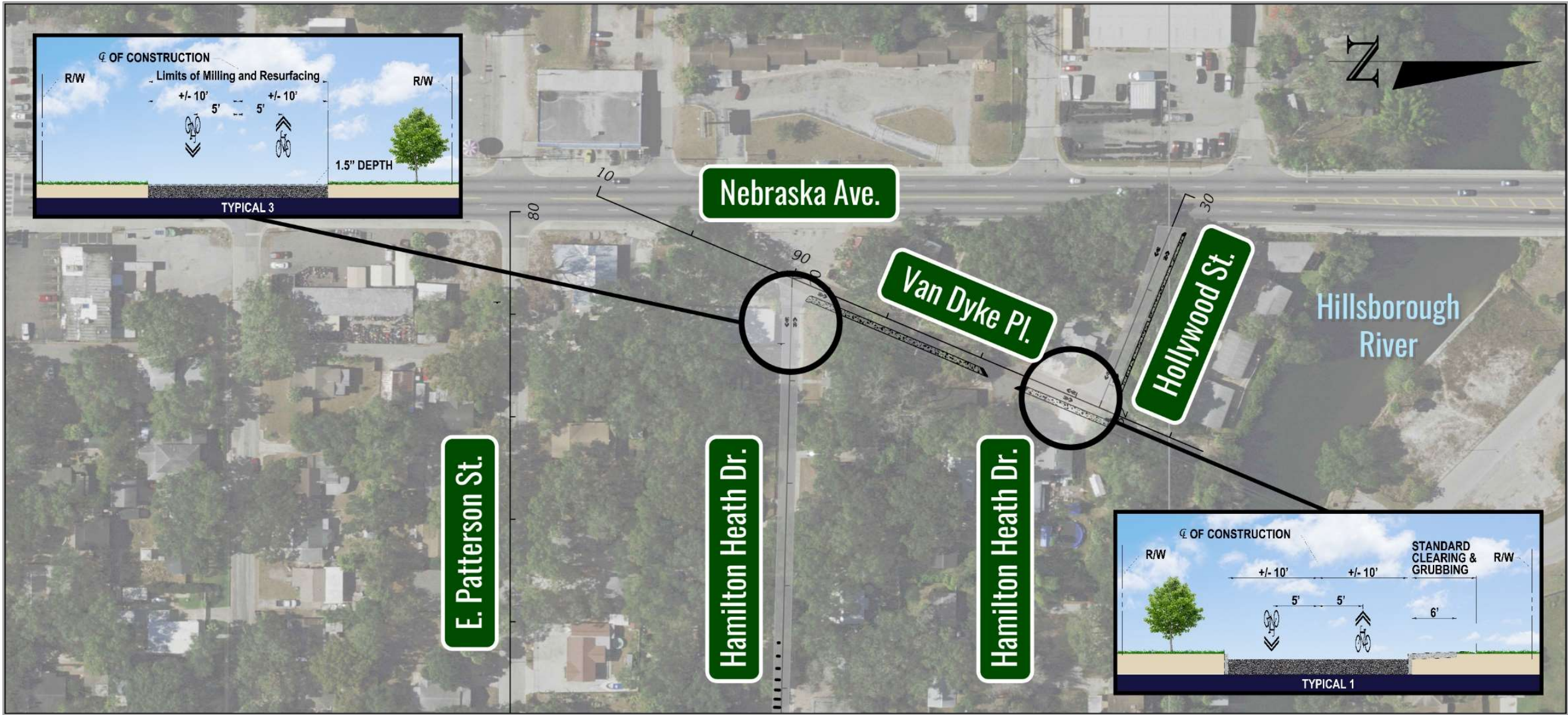


# Typical Section 3 – w/ resurfacing



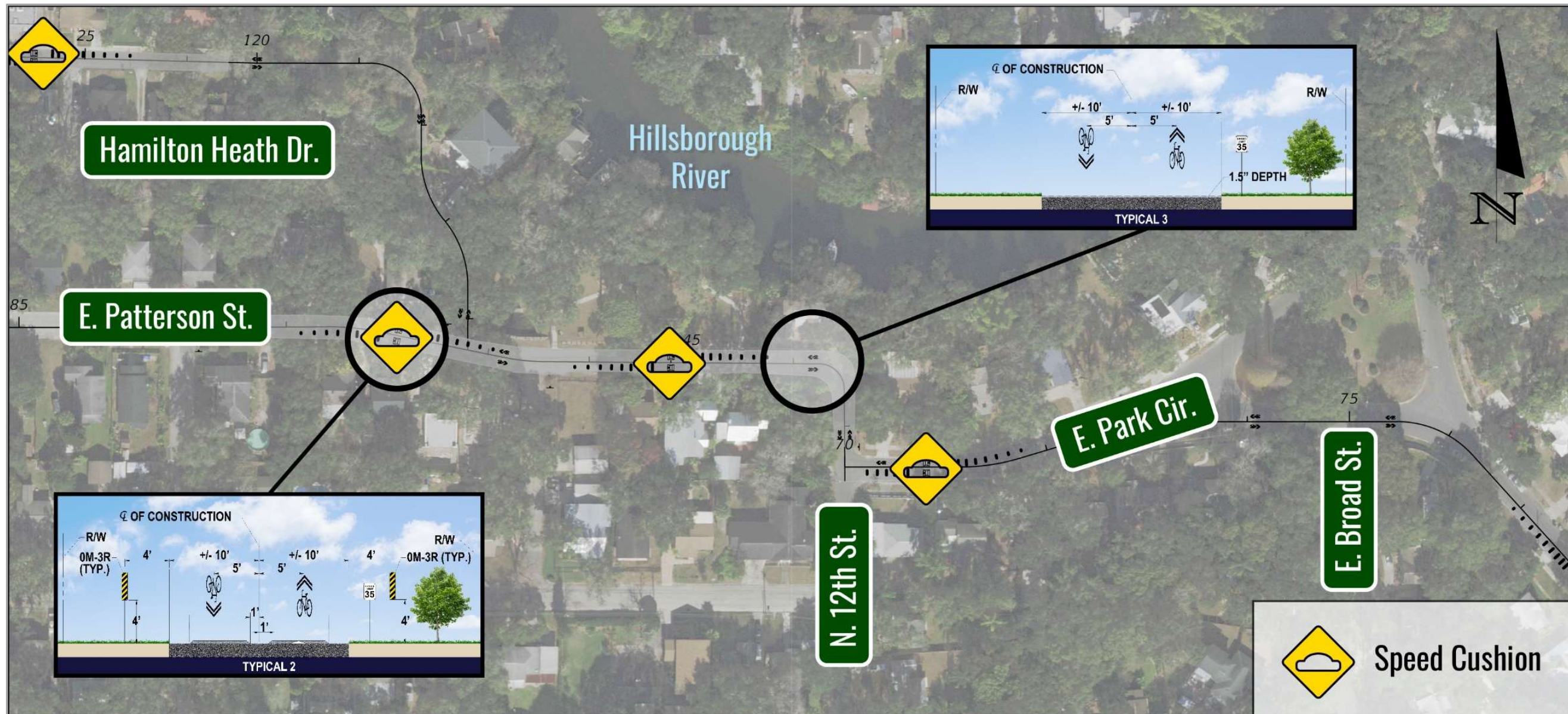


# Nebraska Ave. to Hamilton Heath Dr. and Nebraska Ave. to E. Patterson St.



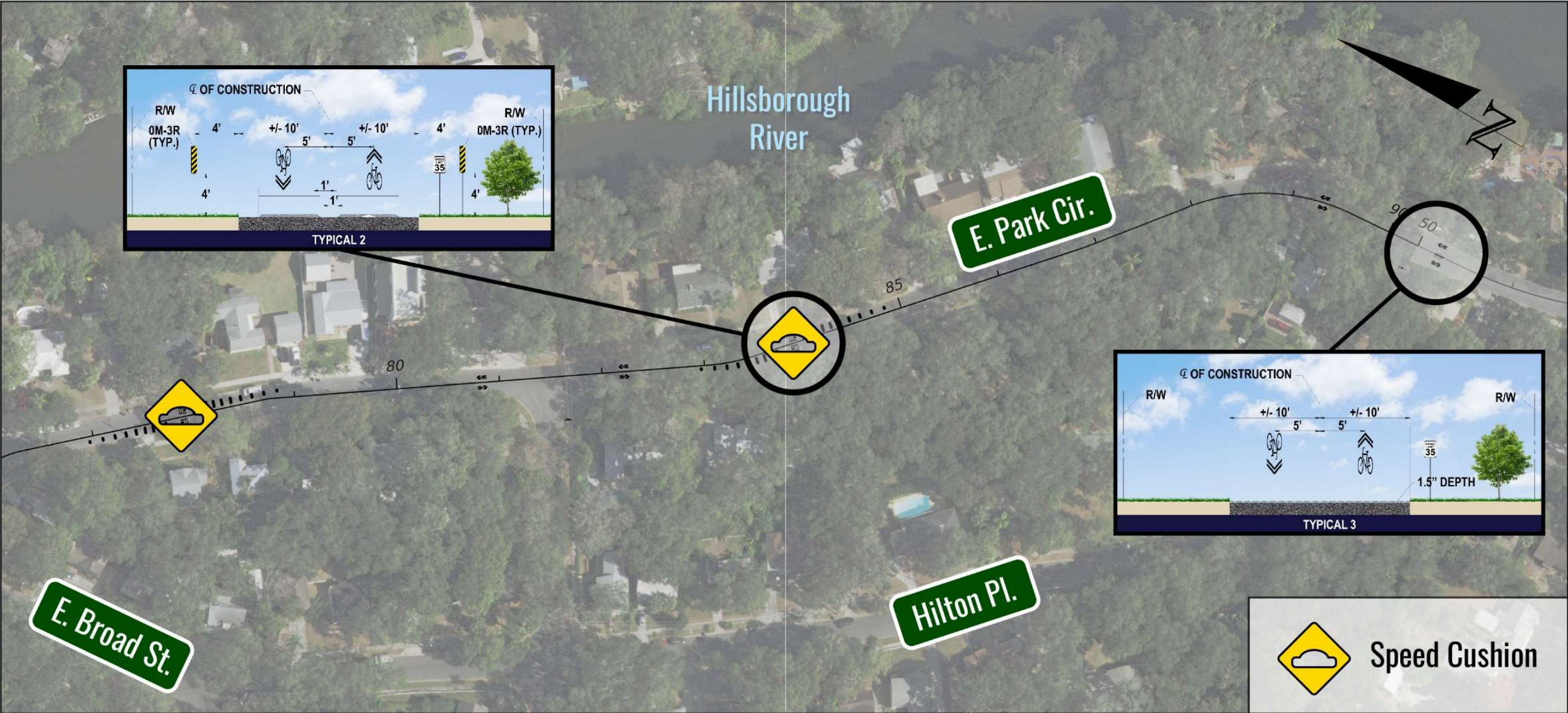


# Hamilton Heath Dr. & E. Patterson St. to E. Park Cir.



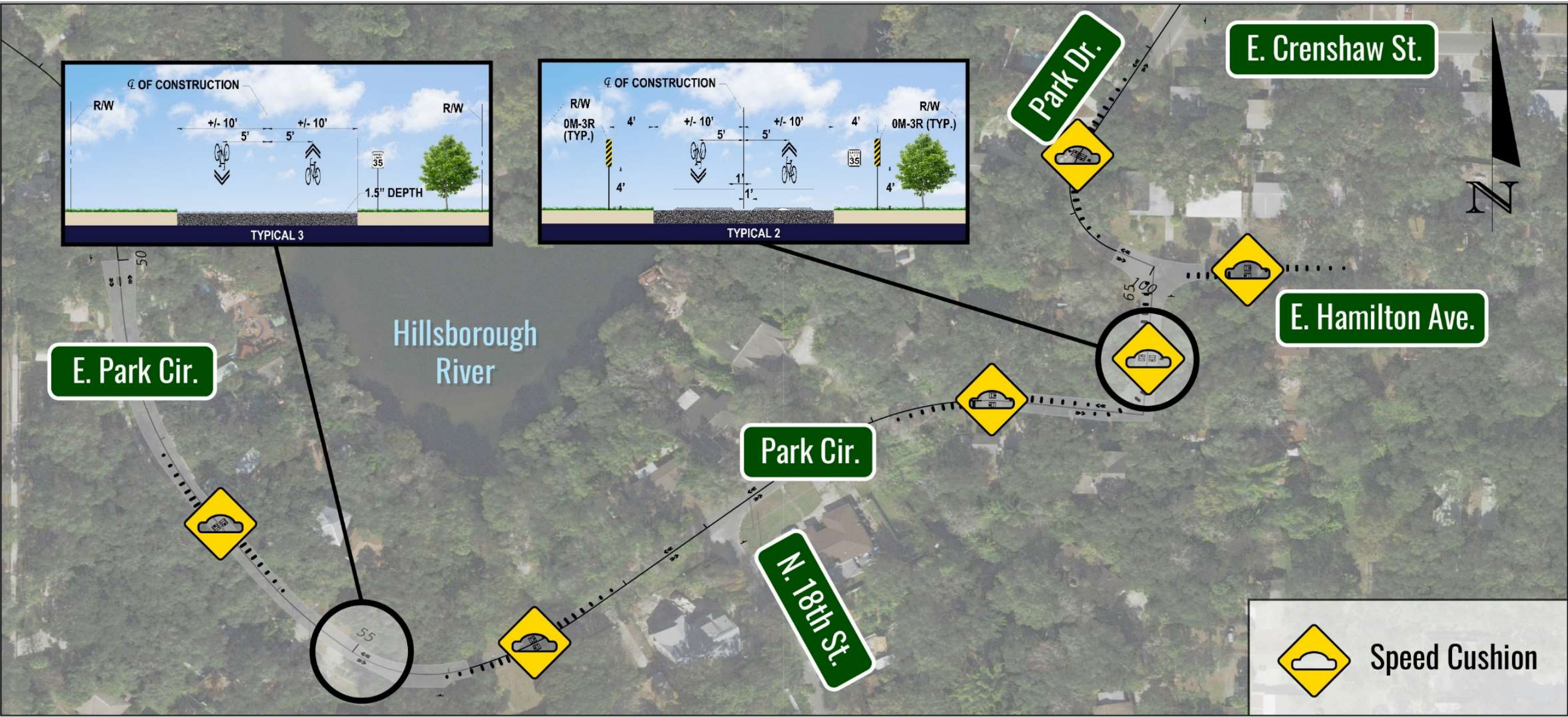

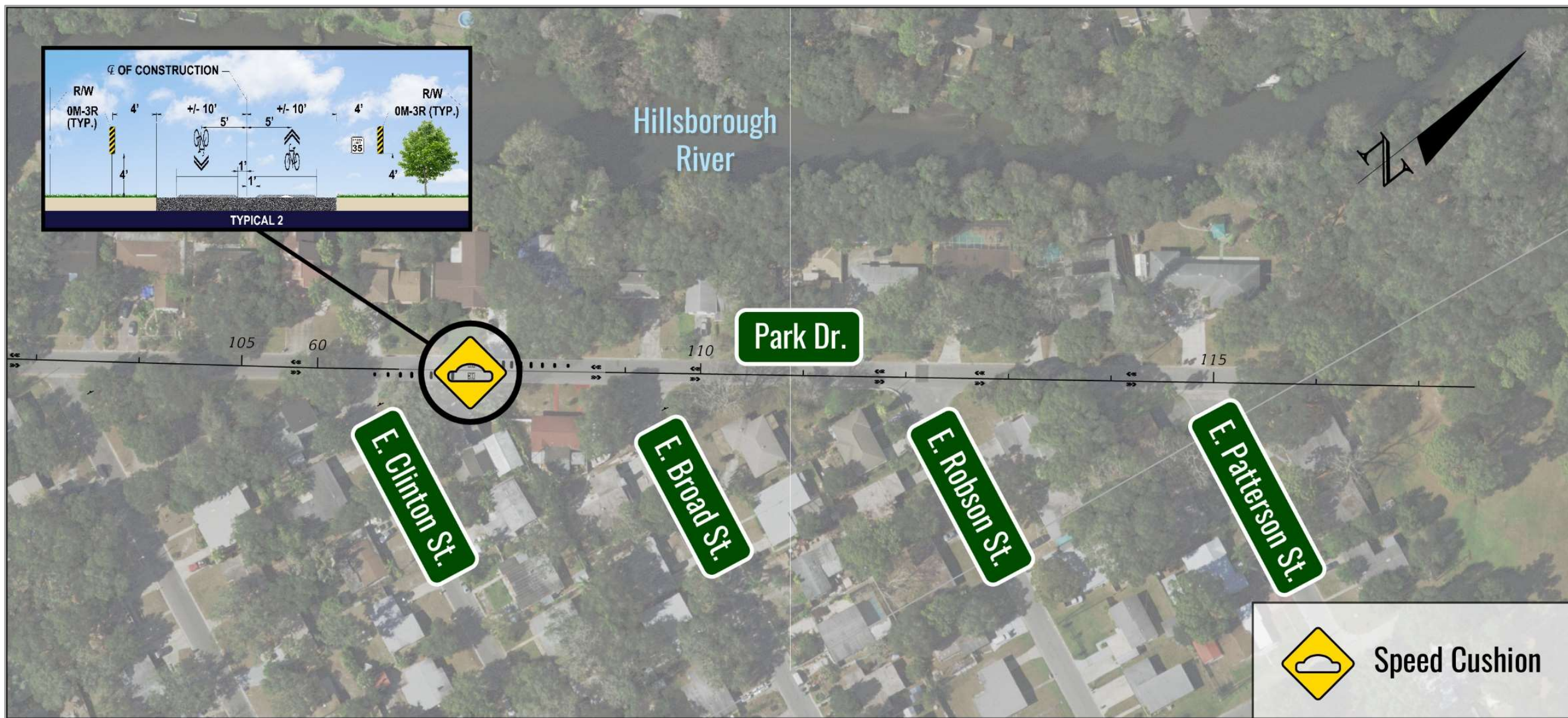


# E. Park Cir. To Park Dr.

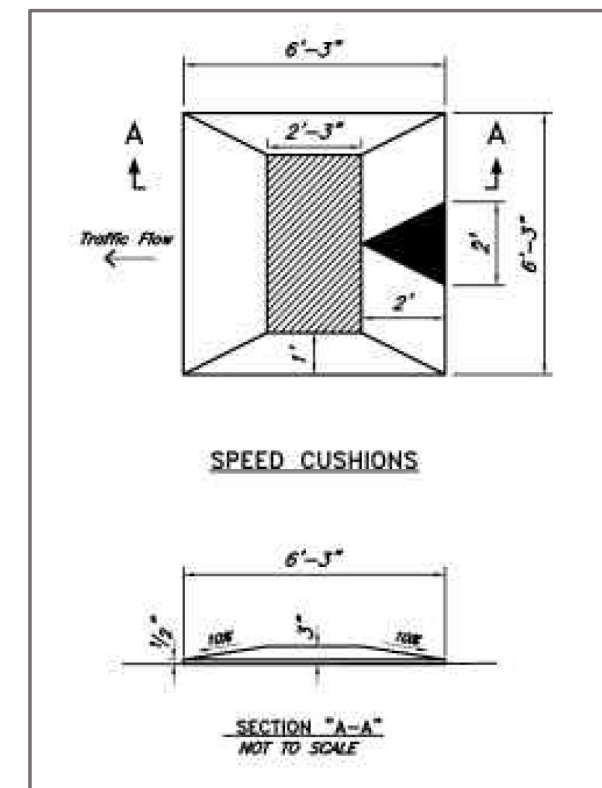

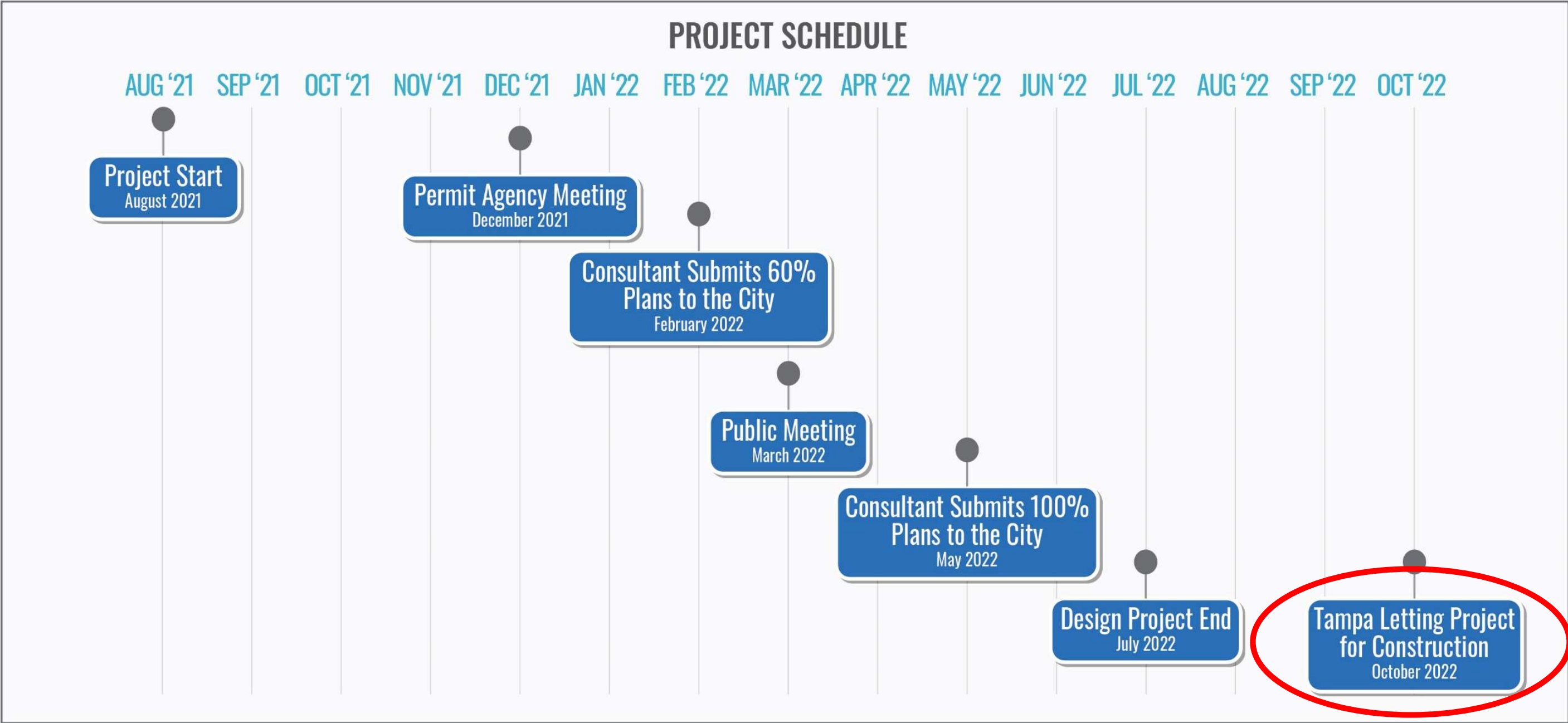
Example of a Speed

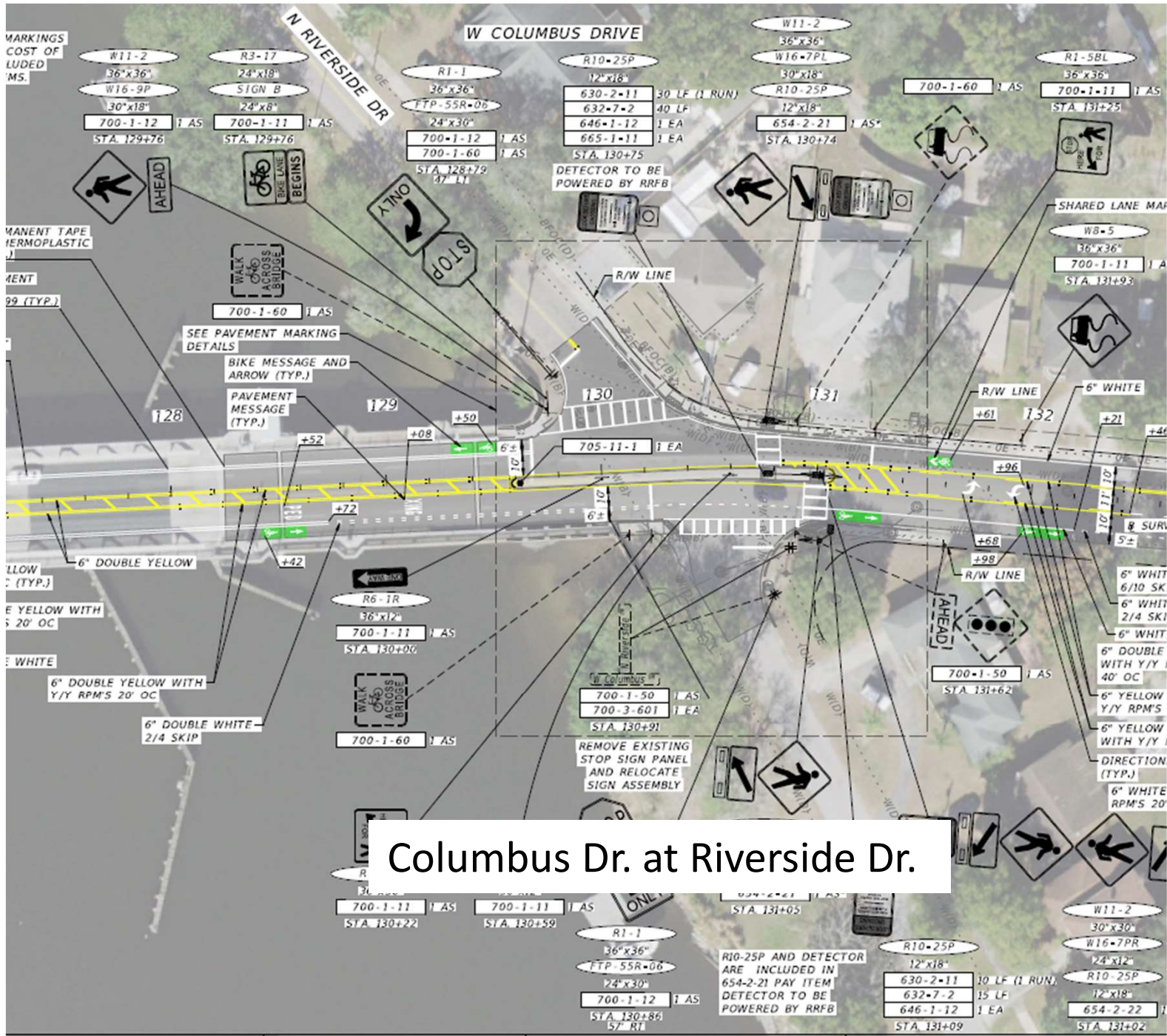
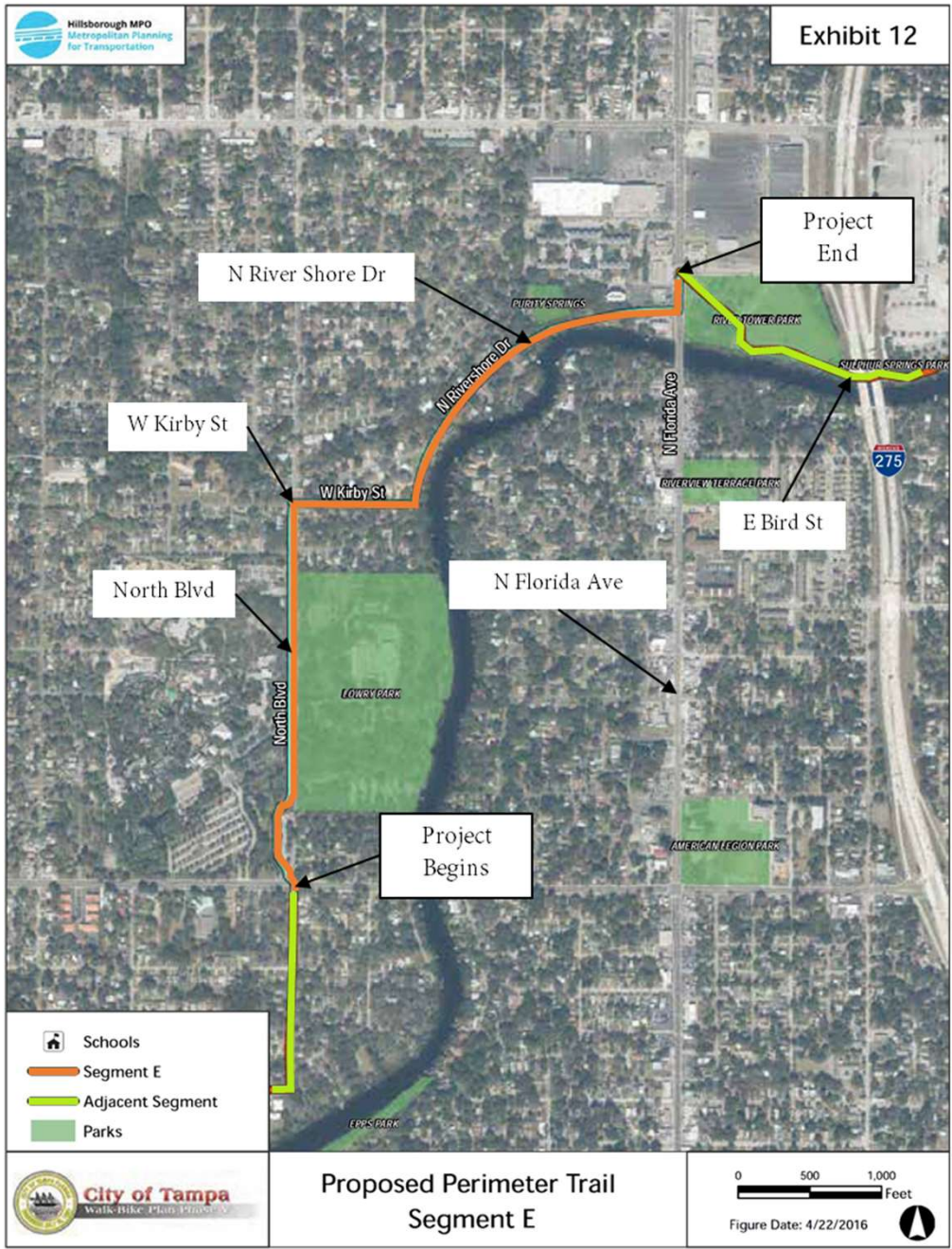
# Where are we now?



- Segment D is in design (Complete 2022)
- Segment E design has been finalized
- Entire Green ARTery was programmed in FY2020
  - \$1M for Design; \$6.5M for Const. (FY 2020 estimate, certainly gone up since then)
  - With the Supreme Court's decision, the original 2018 Surtax is no longer available as a funding source
- We can continue to seek funding for segments and follow up with a comprehensive way-finding network
  - This approach takes time
- Meanwhile, we will focus our efforts on developing safe crossings with our own projects as well as our agency partners.
