TIPPIN WTF, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$669,903; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF TAMPA; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on September 9, 2014, the Mayor received bids, tabulation of such bids being hereto attached for informational purposes, for the construction of Chlorine Piping and Chemical Building Improvements - D. L. Tippin WTF, and recommends to this Council that the proposal of Poole & Kent Company of Florida be accepted, funds therefore being available in the appropriate account;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TAMPA, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1. The proposal of Poole & Kent Company of Florida in the total amount of \$669,903 for construction of the Chlorine Piping and Chemical Building Improvements - D. L. Tippin WTF, in accordance with plans, specifications and other related contract documents prepared by the Contract Administration Department, is hereby approved and accepted; and the Contract is hereby awarded to the said Contractor.

Section 2. This Resolution, which is not part of the contract documents, authorizes the Mayor to execute and the City Clerk to attest and affix the official seal of the City of Tampa to the Contract for and on behalf of the City of Tampa.

Section 3. Plans, specifications and contract documents for the construction of said Project, which documents are now on file in the office of the Contract Administration Department of the City of Tampa, are hereby approved in their entirety or in substantially similar form.

Section 4. The Director of the Contract Administration Department is hereby authorized to issue, in written form only, work directive changes authorizing additions, deletions or revisions resulting from unforeseen conditions or emergencies, said directives to be incorporated in subsequently issued change orders approved by the City Council.


Section 5. Any and all technical errors, informalities and irregularities in the proposal of the Contractor are hereby waived.


The Minority and Small Business Development Office evaluated the Good Faith Effort Compliance Plan (GFCEP) submitted by Poole & Kent of Florida and determined they complied with the requirements of the Equal Business Opportunity Ordinance by having performed meaningful action steps to solicit SLBE/U-WMBE participation.

The bidder successfully solicited SLBE participation to perform electrical work. The scope of the electrical work is valued at \$59,800.00 but Poole & Kent assigned \$333,644 procurement for mechanical equipment to the SLBE which increased their subcontract (LOI) to \$393,444 or 58%. Full credit will not be given for this amount because the equipment is not considered a typical 'commercially-useful-function' for the electrical subcontractor under this project. Therefore, the allowable value that MBD will count toward Pool & Kent's goal attainment is the core electrical work and not the 'pass-through' purchase of mechanical equipment.

Compliance Statement: Total SLBE/U-WMBE participation is 8.9%, of which 8.9% represents Non-Minority Small Local Business Enterprise.
