




**Cross Creek Boulevard Widening**

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

The project consists of the widening of Cross Creek Boulevard from the existing two-lane undivided section to a rural (without curbs) four-lane divided facility. The project will be constructed within existing right-of-way. The project includes a 6' sidewalk along the northern right-of-way; a 12' multi-use, off-road trail along southern right-of-way; an on-road 5'-shoulder as bicycle accommodation; a 22'-median; and upgraded signalization. The project is currently in design phase. The construction cost of this phase of the project is approximately \$6 million.

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**Maintenance of Traffic (MOT) Information**

The MOT will consist of constructing the new southern lanes without impacting existing traffic patterns. Once completed, existing traffic will be shifted to the new travel lanes while the existing travel lanes are milled and resurfaced. Other than minor median construction, the 4-lane facility will then be open creating very little disturbance to existing traffic circulation throughout the construction process.
